Suffolk County Water Authority North Fork Pipeline





- Chair the NFC Working Group on Affordable Housing
 - Meet at least 2x monthly
 - Currently focused on preparing comments to be submitted to Town about proposed zoning update
 - General overview: zoning update doesn't do enough to incentivize/facilitate starter homes and rentals for nurses, teachers, emergency workers, retail personnel, etc. to be able to live where they work
 - Nationally, in communities where ADU's have been encouraged, not many have been built, so they do not end up increasing the housing supply much.





Board Nominations and Voting

- Election is for three open board seats, all 2-year terms
- One open seat to be appointed to complete 1 year of a 2-year term
- Open nominations from the floor
- Nominee introductions, alphabetically by last name
- Cast ballots
- Ballots counted by at least two members who are not running for office
- New board announced to members within one week
